Dear Parents and Students,

Welcome to Ms Jennifer Parkinson's ELA class. I hope to inspire my students to become life-long learners and independent thinkers. I am very excited to be teaching the students and I am looking forward to seeing them grow throughout our themed units of inquiry.

Course Overview:

The students will advance their literacy skills, become familiar with the structure and critical analysis of non-fictional texts, and research, and gain the necessary skills to apply their understanding in proficient written form. Further, the students will read, analyse, and create fiction, and poetry, all aligned with Grade 7 ELA Common Core Standards. In addition, there will be an emphasis on English grammar and conventions in writing. The design of this course takes the individual reading levels of the students into account, and aims to accelerate the students' literacy skills and expose them to a large variety of engaging literature, and guide them to more effective, and evidence-based writing.

Thematic Units:

In Grade 7 ELA students will develop and attain Common Core Standard benchmarks through four thematic units.

- 1. Sensitivity in Memoirs
- 2. Compassion in Classics
- 3. From Utopia to Dystopia
- 4. Research Report and Publishing

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All homework assignments will be shared in Edmodo. Students are responsible for coming to class prepared each day. That means having a pen or pencil, a notebook for only this class, and a folder or binder for only this class. There will be days where students are asked to bring their laptops or use their mobile device if they have one.

Assessments and Grading:

The course will be taught over the entire year with students receiving grades each academic quarter. The grades will be reported using the A-F system with a percentage given out of 100%. Both formative (homework, papers, quizzes, daily participation) and summative (authentic projects, key assignments, exams) assessment tasks will be given that assess both content and skill mastery.

Formative Assessments: 70% (homework, participation, quiz) Summative Assessments: 30% (exam, project, assignment)
